I do not know what can be done with the matter of transferring some of the patients from the Jefferson Davis Hospital to the Houston Negro Hospital.

I recall very well the fact that at the time we built the Houston Negro Hospital the Staff of the Jefferson Davis Hospital were not inclined to take care of patients in the negro hospital. They wanted all the patients in one location and as this is a volunteer Staff we have to give their wishes a great deal of consideration.

We have a Council meeting at 10:30 Wednesday morning July 5th, in my office and I would be very glad to have you come before the Council and discuss this matter.
