Dear Sir:

This owns receipt of yours of  
even date. Needless to say, the information  
contained therein is very disturbing.

As I see it, the proper course  
to pursue would be for the proper officer  
of the Advisory Committee to call for an  
early meeting of its members to discuss the  
matter, following which, if need be, appointing  
a committee to lay the whole situation before  
the City and possibly County officials, who,  
I understand are at this time considering  
enlargements that under proper arrangements  
with the Negro Hospital would seem to be  
wholly unnecessary, and it would further  
seem to me that the Advisory Committee,  
possibly with the aid of the press, should  
be able to convince them of that fact.

Meantime, I trust that through  
Dr. Slaughter or otherwise the action proposed  
by the State Committee on Nursing will be  
deferred temporarily.
