KATHY HENDERSON NAMED JUNIOR ROTARIAN BY DEER PARK HIGH SCHOOL FACULTY MEMBERS



FINAL MATCH OF 1969 "SWWG" TOMORROW
AS ARDA AND BEARD PLAY FOR \$30,000


Frank Beard, an American pro, and Ben Arda, a Filipino, compete in the final match of a \$164,000 international elimination tournament on "Shell's Wonderful World of Golf." The match, filmed at the Medinah Country Club in Medinah, Ill., will be telecast in color, Saturday, March 1, over KPRC-TV, Channel 2, at 4:00 p.m.

Each player won \$17,000 in preliminary and semifinal matches. The winner of the final match receives an additional \$20,000, and the loser is awarded \$10,000.

Arda, the 125-pound "toy tiger" of golf who has never competed on the USPGA tour, defeated four top touring professionals to reach the finals. In a preliminary victory at the Manila Golf and Country Club, Republic of the Philippines, he beat Billy Casper and Gene Littler. Arda then advanced to the finals by defeating Roberto DeVicenzo and Dan Sikes at Canada's London Hunt and Country Club, Ontario, Canada.

Beard, a top money winner on the USPGA tour, outplayed Gardner Dickinson and Julius Boros in a preliminary match at the Caymanas Golf and Country Club, Kingston, Jamaica. He earned his ticket to the finals by defeating Arnold Palmer and Doug Sanders at the PGA National Golf Club in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida.

The contest closes out the tournament on "Shell's Wonderful World of Golf," but does not end Shell's 1969 television series. An exhibition match among three top women golfers will be aired on Sunday, March 9. The match features Sandra Haynie, Carol Mann and Kathy Whitworth, and was filmed at The Royal Bangkok Sports Club, Bangkok, Thailand.





AVOID TWO HAZARDS




