President Fowler reported on the activities of the Summer Senate Committee as follows:

1. Approval of half-scale salary for President of the Student Association and approval of full-scale salary for Secretary of the Student Association, during the summer.
2. Legislation by the University of Houston Administration of the Organizations Board which will be subject to review by the Student Senate in the fall, although the structure of the Board itself will appear in the Student Handbook.
3. Composition of the Proposed Senate Rules of Procedure.

President Fowler reported on his own activities during the summer as President of the Student Association as follows:

1. Planning physical arrangements for plastic ID Cards.
2. Planning a more academically structured Orientation Program.
3. Planning the Student Life Policies and the Student Handbook.

President Fowler invited all Senators to be present at an interview for the new position of Assistant Dean of Students, Wednesday, July 29, 1964, 11:30 A.M., Dean of Men's Office, with Bill Swift, SMU's Dean of Men.

Senator Smith, Business, moved to go into Old Business. The motion was seconded, and it passed by a unanimous voice vote.

Senator Barnett, Law, moved to accept the Proposed Senate Rules of Procedure in toto. Senator Cassidy, Graduate, seconded, and the motion passed by a unanimous voice vote.

Senator Douglas, Pharmacy, moved to make the Senate Rules retroactive. Senator Soffar, Arts and Sciences, seconded. After discussion, Senator Douglas, Pharmacy, withdrew his motion.

Senator Smith, Business, moved that the next meeting be on Monday, August 31, 1964, 7:00 P.M., in Room 204 of the Roy Cullen Building. Senator Hoffman, Education, seconded, and the motion passed by a unanimous voice vote.

Senator Eriksen, Engineering, moved to adjourn. Senator Sicola, Arts and Sciences, seconded, and the meeting adjourned at 8:00 P.M.
