HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
MINUTES

The meeting of the House of Representatives was called to order at 8:30 p.m., December 5, 1960, by Jim Boyd, Speaker of the House of Representatives. The minutes were read by Clerk Harriett Waldvogel, in lieu of the secretary who was absent, and approved as read.

The Speaker called for Committee reports:

Marc Grossberg, Chairman of the Monetary and Fiscal Committee, reported that House Bill #8 had been tabled since no copies had been presented to the committee. Both House Bill #6 and House Bill #7 were approved by the committee.

Carolyn Langford, Committee member of the Social Educational and Development Committee, reported that in a joint committee meeting with the Senate committee, the date of Cougar Christmasland was set for Monday, December 19, 1960, at 7:30. Another meeting was to be held Wednesday, December 7, at 7:00 p.m. in the Student Government office. Each participating organization was urged to have a representative present.

Harriett Waldvogel of the Certification and Installation Committee read the names of new members to be sworn in and these people then took the oath of office.

Jim Boyd called for Old Business.

Ira Slober made the second reading of House Bill #6 and moved that the bill be accepted. The motion was seconded and carried.

House Bill #7 was read for the second time by Fred Doehring. He moved that the House approve Bill #7. The motion was seconded and carried.

Paul Stigaard moved that House Bill #8 be removed from the table in committee so a vote could be made. This motion was seconded and carried. The second reading of this bill was made. Paul Stigaard moved that the bill be accepted. An amendment was made that lodging be changed from \$30. to \$21. and food be changed from \$20. to \$18., giving a total of \$437.86. The amendment and bill passed.

New Business was called.

Clerk Harriett Waldvogel made the first reading of House Bill #11, the bill for the American Institute of Industrial Engineers.

Bill Lipscomb, I.F.C., read a resolution requesting the appropriation of funds to buy a Texas flag and to erect a pole for it. It was moved and seconded that the House Rules be suspended in order to vote on the resolution. After Bill moved the acceptance of the

resolution, Arnold Nemore moved that it be tabled. This motion was seconded and carried.

The House moved and seconded that Barlow Simmons be appointed to the position of Attorney General. The motion carried.

Arnold Nemore moved that the meeting be adjourned. It was seconded and the meeting was adjourned at approximately 9:45 p.m.
