Dear Mrs Cunningham,-

If I enclosed any thing in my letter to you it was not the card I intended to as I find it on my desk. The truth is I hate to send it for any purpose even to help. I can stand any thing in the line of abuse but filth upsets me and I want to get as far away from it as possible.

I thought when I got home I would not go on another Jaunt for any thing or any body, but before I know it I am persuaded that it is my duty to go with Mr. Taft and President Lowell on a tour for three weeks in the hope of helping to arouse the people to the danger of the failure of the ratification of the League of Nations. There is going to be a big effort to get a few Republican Senators to stand pat for amendments and thus insure its defeat. It seems to me that any such attempt at this time, with all the unrest in the world, should condemn any man to be sent to Germany where he belongs. I am to have a compartment in a private car to be taken care of. It is thought that it is very important to get the women back of the movement. It is very funny that two such anti-suffragists as Taft has been and as Lowell is, should send me word that, "of all the women before the public You are the best one to do this work" I cannot help being amused even though I am not at all in a good mood

at having to go. Whenever these anties want any thing done they have to call on a suffragest to do it.

Tomorrow I go to New York to speak at an anti-lynching meeting. I do not know what I will be asked to do next. Oh yes I do I have had two very insistant letters to be a charter member of A Volintary Parenthood Society. This by a very ardent suffragest. I wonder what fool thing women will want to do next before they have a ny power to do any thing. If they wouldstop all these eutopian theroies until we get the Federal amend ment ratified I would not care what they did, There wouldbe enough level headed women to keep the majority from wanting to save the world over night.

I think of you with great affection and sympathy. I shall need all you have to spare before I get back from my tour. I do not start on it until the 20th. In the mean time I am going to see Mrs Catt and spend three days in N.Y. and then go to Atlantic City for a week then to Wash ington and Greensboro N.C. then off on that three weeks trip. I find life interesting even if it is strenuous.
