UNITED FUND COMMITTEE SETS REFINERY CAMPAIGN GOAL AT \$40,000

A goal of \$40,000 was set Wednesday by the Refinery United Fund committee for the 1973 campaign.

This goal is a 3.3% increase per employee over last year's goal.

A fast-paced three-day campaign will be held here September 10-14, in which departmental solicitors will contact each employee.

As in last year's solicitation, the MTM Process R&D Lab employees will be asked to contribute through the Research Complex drive.

Directing the campaign at the Refinery are Hank Krebs and Don Chrismer. Assisting are campaign committeemen, Chuck Vasek, Frank Dismuke, Joe Newman, Joe Allen, Marvin Benton, Grover Dunn, Ray Crawford, John Kindla, Dotti West, Wayne Dawson, Bill Carter, and W. J. Duchie.

Solicitors for each department will be announced soon. A group of about 50 solicitors selected by a lottery and committeemen will tour two United Fund agencies on Thursday, September 6. A chartered bus will leave the Refinery at 8 a.m. and take the group to the Lighthouse for the Blind and the Harris County Center for the Retarded.

Through the money raised by the United Fund in this area, 44 agencies are assisted in providing adult services, child welfare, youth and recreation, casework and counseling, community, general health and neighborhood services. Over 92 cents of every dollar donated goes to the agencies. Less than eight cents per dollar is used for year-round administration and campaign expenses through the participation of volunteers working with a small professional staff.

This year's goal for all of Harris County is \$11,300,000. The 1972 goal was \$10,800,000 of which the Refinery contributed \$41,369.

IN EFFORT TO CONTRIBUTE TO BLACK COMMUNITY, LEON RICHARDSON ASSISTS SICKLE CELL DRIVE

Leon Richardson, of the Refinery Lab and the father of a two-year-old son, became interested in assisting the foundation while watching a telethon on sickle cell. Wishing to express his thanks to the black community in which he grew up, Richardson went out into his neighborhood and collected \$200.


The second annual Sickle Cell Disease Telethon, aired by Channel 11 on August 12, 1973, initiated a massive local campaign for pledges and donations to the Sickle Cell Disease Research Foundation of Texas, Inc. The SCDRFT is the brainchild of the Houston Chapter of the Links, Inc. It is a private, non-profit, incorporated, tax-free organization committed to the establishment of a comprehensive program of screening, genetic counseling, education, and research designed to combat sickle cell disease. The foundation officially organ-

ized in August 1971 operates solely from receipts from the telethon with individual and corporate donations from Houston and neighboring areas. Shell Oil Company has actively participated in the past and present drives for donations. A goal of \$150,000 has been established for 1973 to continue research at the Baylor College of Medicine and cover rising operational expenses. Present collections total approximately \$65,000.


Richardson stated that in a recent telephone conversation with Dr. John E. Codwell, his former high school principal and President of the Board of Directors of the Foundation, it was stated that "the foundation is not and has not been funded by any government health program or the United Fund. The foundation is presently awaiting action on a proposal for assistance submitted to the Office of Health, Education and Welfare."

Sickle cell anemia is a serious blood disorder that is inherited, painful and sometimes fatal. There are two recognized forms of the disease: the sickle cell trait and the sickle cell disease. The sickle cell trait carriers usually lead completely normal lives. The main danger for a carrier is possible transmission of the disease to his or her offspring. Some of the symptoms are increased fatigue, poor hemoglobin supply, decreased exercise ability, and swelling with pain in afflic-



ted areas (mostly arms, legs, or stomach). Severe swelling and pain signal a "crisis" in the cycle of the disease. The disease affects one out of every four hundred black Americans with the trait in one of every ten. There have been cases, mostly in Asiatic countries, where whites have been stricken with the disease. Currently, medical science has no cure for sickle cell disease. Two commonly practiced diagnostic procedures are Sickledex and Hemoglobin Electrophoresis screening.

FAITH WATSON WINS WAYLAND BAPTIST SCHOLARSHIP AFTER EARNING ACADEMIC, CAGE HONORS AT TEMPLE

Faith Watson, daughter of Lube's Ed, has just accepted a basketball scholarship from Wayland Baptist College.

A graduate of Deer Park High School, Faith has completed two years at Temple Junior College where she was not only an honor student but also one of that school's outstanding athletes.

Faith is listed in Who's Who Among Students in American Junior Colleges and Outstanding College Athletes of America.

Just this last season, she took more honors than any other woman basketball player in the conference. She was also selected to the National All-American Women's Basketball team for junior colleges.

Playing forward for Temple, she has shattered long standing records to become "one of that school's all-time greats."

Named an outstanding athlete at Temple for two years, she has scored 1,107 points, averaged 17.8 points per game, set the Temple record for most points scored during a game--38; hit 72% of free throws and 50% of field goals. In addition, she broke a record in free throws in a season by throwing 157, holds single game record for free throws, and holds record for most rebounds in a single game.


