Cheerleaders, celebs highlight UW kick-off rallies

Thousands of folks — nearly everyone at the Complex, in fact — attended Monday's kick-off rallies for the annual United Way fund drive. They listened to endorsements from a state congressman, community service representatives, even two cheering members of the Derrick Dolls. But no matter who did the talking, the message stayed the same.

"Your United Way contribution is the best investment in town," said Dara Gill, a United Way spokesperson at the rallies. "Your contributions stay here to benefit folks in this area. One out of every three people in Houston — that's about one million people — benefit from United Way services. Last year, 1,300 Shell employees used the United Way, so it works for you and your own families, too."

The United Way supports 83 agencies providing 284 different services in the three-county Texas Gulf Coast area. There are 2,100 United Way offices in the United States and 100 in Canada, plus representatives in 15 countries around the world.

Refinery Superintendent Bill Thompson pointed to the Shell Foundation's \$1.1 million donation this year as evidence of "the depth of Shell's commitment to the United Way." That gift was the first in Houston to come from an oil company and only the seventh million-dollar gift ever received by the United Way.
