

## SAFER SEX AND THE LESBIAN

I am writing this article out of concern for all my sisters, their children, and families. At times it is hard for me to believe the level of ignorance that women, especially lesbians have in regard to their risk of contracting AIDS. AIDS has become the 5th leading cause of death for women of childbearing years, in the U.S. HIV infection is growing most rapidly in women and children of color and the impoverished. HIV/AIDS, like other sexually transmitted diseases is a woman's health care issue.

In all the recent talk about prevention of transmission of HIV/AIDS and other sex related diseases, there has been very little directed toward women, and lesbians in particular. There seems to be this assumption in the community that lesbians have the safest thing going. This presumption of low or no risk puts us at high risk because we do not take steps to protect ourselves or our lovers. In truth, we can be at risk of HIV infection from a variety of activities, such as genital to genital stimulation, sex toys that are shared, vaginal-anal digital intercourse, mouth to anus contact, mouth to vaginal contact. Participation in any of these activities with an HIV infected partner puts you at risk because of the exchange of infected blood and vaginal secretions, including menstrual blood.

Another route of transmission less discussed is lesbians that have sex with HIV infected men.

You may be at risk if you or your partner have ever shot up drugs and shared needles or had sex with and IV drug user.

If you have been inseminated with semen from an infected donor you could be at risk, or if the antibody status is not known.

The other risk is if you have had a blood transfusion or blood products between 1977 and 1985.

The following are ways to limit your risk of infection:

Be aware that if you have sex when you are drunk or high you are more likely to take sexual risks.

Use a disposable latex glove, finger cot, or a small condom during all hand to genital contact or penetration.

Place a dental dam, thin sheet of latex or non-microwave plastic wrap between the vulva and tongue during oral-genital contact

Don't share sex toys unless you clean them with 10% bleach and water solution.

If you have sex with a man, use a condom or spermicide. Nonoxynol-9 found in diaphragm cream and jelly, contraceptive sponges, helps prevent diseases from being transmitted. It has been shown to kill the HIV virus in lab studies.

Remember, don't wait until you are in the bedroom to discuss safe sex, and don't assume your partner will be insulted or offended. She may be relieved that you are concerned too!

## OUR PRIDE

As Houston Lesbian and Gay Pride Week '92 nears, inevitable comparisons are made by observers as to how recent Pride celebrations differ from those of "the good old days" and how we as a people have changed as a result of Stonewall, AIDS, coming out and the politics of it all.

For those who remember, our history is rich in color and personalities, courage, fear, closets, brutal laws and Pride. As more of us are sick, and dying, as we forget, or if we never knew, we are losing ourselves and our history.

There is no collective, authoritative, published account of Lesbian and Gay Pride in Houston. There exists no written reports of the need for or the birth of our institutions such as AIDS Foundation Houston, or Mary's or Pride Week. Jazz Paz, AIDS nurse, public educator, activist and writer and a native Houstonian, is researching our past for a book of historical record of ourselves and OUR PRIDE. She solicits your memories, pictures, and old newspaper clippings to assist in her endeavor. Specifically, she covets interviews with anyone associated with past Lesbian and Gay Pride celebrations in Houston, and with those who demonstrate Our Pride by organizing efforts such as Queer Nation, WomynSpace, The Gay and Lesbian Hotline, The Colt 45s, The Lone Star Symphonic Band, and organizers/volunteers representing all our community activities of the past and present.


