

UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON STUDENT SENATE MEETING

DATE: November 20, 1961

TIME: 8:30 PM

PLACE: Dean's Conference Room, Ezekiel Cullen Building

The third regular meeting of the University Student Senate was called to order by Otto Grenwelge, President of the Senate.

John Perdue gave the invocation.

The minutes were then read and approved. It was also reported that Lester Hewitt had withdrawn from the Senate Investigations Committee, and would be replaced by Hugh Sticksel.

John Greene gave a report on the Faculty Senate meeting.

John Greene, chairman of the Club Constitution Committee, gave a report on the various applicant clubs and their constitutions.

The clubs are as follows:

Associated Retailers Organization: instills spirit in the Downtown School, creates better relations between the University and businessmen, no similar organization on campus (Passed, 12-0)

Arab Students in the United States of America: need to establish better diplomatic relations, no other such organization on campus (Passed, 12-0)

Channeleers: unfavorable committee recommendation, would offer duplication of services already rendered (Failed, 0-10)

Women's Student Association: conflict in organization's constitution (Failed, 0-12)

Cougar Rifles: no such organization on campus now, there is a need for this club (Passed, 10-1)

Richard Brooks reported on rulings by the Monetary and Fiscal Committee. The following bills were reported favorable and were passed:

- American Society of Mechanical Engineers (#2), \$251.98
- American Academy of optometry (#3), \$425.73
- National Interfraternity Conference (#4), \$418.90
- Cougar Christmasland (#5), \$300.00

John Van Hook announced plans for Cougar Christmasland. It will take place on December 14, 1961, from 6:30 to 8:30 PM.

OLD BUSINESS: Hugh Sticksel was approved as th appoined senator from the College of Optometry.

- American Academy of Optometry, #3 (Passed 11-0)
 - I.F.C., #4 (Passed, 12-0)
 - Cougar Christmasland, #5 (Passed, 11-0)

The Civil Engineering Bill (#6) was read for the first time.

In closing, Jim Perdue told of the Oklahoma State Student Government and their activities.

Charlie Prause moved to adjourn, and the meeting was adjourned.
