My Dear Miss Denny:

As you are doubtless aware, Mr. J. D. Sallas, of Crockett expresses himself as undecided on the question of Suffrage, stating he would vote for Submission if the women of his town wanted it, in spite of the fact that he is personally opposed. Will you, therefore, kindly write to the Suffragists in Crockett, giving this message, and urging that they deluge Mr. Sallas with letters requesting that he vote for Submission; that the bill has been reported favorably out of committee and will come up in the House on February 6th. We do not doubt Mr. Sallas' sincerity, and it looks now as if his vote was only a matter of the sufficient amount of pressure from his constituents. And I would especially request a letter to him from yourself, giving your reasons for desiring his favorable vote.
