

## EMPLOYEES RECEIVE COMPREHENSIVE FIRE TRAINING AT TEXAS A&M

A group of 35 employees left the refinery Wednesday, September 15, at 8:30 a.m. arriving at the College Station Ramada Inn at eleven.

After changing into work clothes, they had lunch. They then left for the fire training field where they were briefed by A&M staff members before donning bunker coats, hip boots and helmets. Immediately thereafter they began participating in fire fighting techniques.

They initially entered the fire training activities performing as individuals but completed their training

session performing as skilled members of teams confident of their ability to perform in an emergency situation.

"While on the fire training field, you got wet, hot, smelly, singed, but happy," says safety supervisor J. B. Floyd.

Upon returning to the Ramada Inn each evening, the hospitality room was open for games and refreshments.

The second refinery group is now undergoing fire training in College Station, and on Monday, the third chemical plant group will be departing for the same training.

The eight fire fighting sessions began with a chemical group leaving September 13 and will be completed October 8 when the fourth refinery group departs from College Station.

**UNITED FUND COMMITTEES COLLECT \$54,600 BY NOON TUESDAY**

At least one Shell employee viewing the United Fund film, hosted by TV anchorman Ron Stone, has first-hand knowledge as to the services provided by Harris County Center for the Retarded, a UF agency - that is lab technician Andy Sanchez.

Six years ago he and his wife, Delia, had their first and only child, a son. Three weeks after his birth, the infant developed spinal meningitis, which resulted in brain damage and retardation. "Andy is multi-handicapped," notes his father, as he relates

taking his child at three years to the Harris County Center for the Retarded in Houston. Young Andy couldn't walk or talk. He still can't talk, but as those of you who saw the UF film know, he can now walk unaided. He leads his parents to what he wants and through sounds, which they have learned to recognize, lets them know what he needs.

Andy has been with Shell seven years in the Quality Control Lab.


Another employee utilizing United Fund agencies

is Gail Lang, secretary to Engineering Superintendent Jack Cox. Gail's five-year-old daughter, Lynette, went into convulsions at three years. While hospitalized for testing, the doctors discovered that the left side of her brain had never developed.

Lynette now attends the Harris County Center for the Retarded where she is learning new skills.

As of noon Tuesday \$54,600 had been collected for the complex. Broken down, \$14,300 was given by 48 percent of chemical employees, \$29,000 by 58 percent of refinery employees and \$11,300 by 30 percent of complex employees.


We still have \$46,900 left to collect before reaching our united goal of \$101,500.





