

November 23, 1964

A regular meeting of the Student Senate was called to order by President Fowler at 7:10 p.m., on Monday, November 23, 1964, in Room 230 of the Fred Heyne Building.

Jim Smith moved to by-pass the reading of the minutes. John Daigle seconded and the minutes were approved as written.

President Fowler announced that Dean Yardley would have a report ready on the Organizations Policy at the next Senate meeting.

President Fowler announced the schools that had held constituency and reminded others of their duty.

President Fowler read a letter from President Hoffman regarding the governing of the University Center. The governing body will be a joint student-faculty board called the University Center Board. It will consist of 8 students out of the 13 members with a student as chairman of the Board.

President Hoffman asked for Senate recommendations for the members of the committee from a wide range of interests. President Fowler referred this action to the Student Life Committee.

Committee reports:

RULES AND JUDICIAL - Betty Barnes reported that no action had been taken concerning the absence from 5 Senate meetings by Guy Haltom from Arts & Sciences as three absences had been due to illness.

The committee recommended approval of MaryAnn Odell as second alternate to the Traffic Appeals Board.

Judy Hoffman moved to accept the committee report. Bill Soffar seconded and the report was accepted.

FISCAL AND GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS - Helen Cassidy reported that the committee recommended additional appropriations to the Budget as follows:

Cheerleader Expense	585.00

Bill Soffar moved to accept the committee report. John Daigle seconded and the report was accepted.

STUDENT LIFE - Bill Walker reported that the committee recommended of the naming of the streets bill; and the University Center Policy was still in committee.

Judy Hoffman moved to accept the committee report. Don Barnett seconded and the report was accepted.

Old business:

Jim Smith moved to accept the addition appropriations to the Koobraey Ball and Cheerleader Expense accounts. Bill Soffar seconded and the appropriations were accepted unanimously.

Jim Smith moved to approve the appointment of MaryAnn Odell to second alternate on the Traffic Appeals Board. Betty Barnes seconded and the appointment was accepted.

Bill Soffar moved to discharge the Library Hours Bill from committee. Robert Shumway seconded and the Bill was discharged. Bob Brackman moved to add a new Section II to the Bill to read that 10:00 to 12:00 shall be accommodation hours and that no books shall be checked out during these hours; and to make the present Section II as Section III. Mike Douglas seconded and the amendment carried. Bill No. 15 on Library Hours passed as amended unanimously.


