My dear Mrs. Cunningham:-

In an interview held by one of our lobbyists yesterday with Eugene Black, of your State, he made the assertion that 95% of the women of his district did not want the vote. In view of this would it not be possible to have some letters sent from his district explaining that he was mistaken in his estimate of what the women wanted? It seems to me that that would do a great deal of good in two ways; 1. in showing the women of the district that any apathy on their part is constantly translated into open opposition, and 2. to Mr. Black, in showing him his mistake; and also in letting him know that there is an underground wire between Washington and Texas.
