Signed on typewriter and this letter sent, written indivudually, to each State Officer (Except Miss Brackenridge) and each Senatorial District Chairman. in open envelope, - l¢ postage.

My dear : It was to miss 12 that I partie what it to the Shate town what it to the deliberation 12, 1317. Longle to be, put please send they a copy at thee.

'My Dear Executive Board Member

In accordance with the instructions of the State Suffrage Convention, in May, and with the Executive Board meeting in Dallas, in October. I have emgaged Miss Donna hoverts as State "insacial Campaign Manager to assist in raising the State budget of fifty thoupaign Manager to assist in raising the State budget of fifty thousand dollars with which to put Texas in the column of white states.

Inasmuch as the present flood tide of public sentiment is due primarily to those wonderfully courageous pioneer Suffragists, and inasmuch as newer workers do forget this occasionally and rashly claim or acolaim credit where indeed some credit may be due, but not by any means all or even a major part of the credit for success is due; and inasmuch as Texas is too great a state in other ways to accidentally be betrayed into the smallness of ingratirude: I propose that the fifty thousand dollar campaign fund which we are reising for Texas, and which I confidently believe will enable us to place Texas on the winning side in the next eighteen months, he named the Brackenridge Suffrage Foundation Fund, in honor of our leader and Honorary President, Miss M. Bloanor brackenridge, whose pieceer work for our Cause needs no eulogy from me to you, and her brother, Col. Geo" W. Prackenridge, whose watchful chivelry has done so much to advance woman's position in college and industry throughout the state and to whom women owe the opening of certain closed doors even in far New York.

Further, I suggest that we report this action publicly on the floor of the National Convention, meeting in Washington in December, so that our National officers and the delegates from other states may be in no doubt as to whom we acclaim leader of the Buffragemovement in Towas.
