

The meeting was called to order by Speaker Bill Hensley at 8 p.m. Following the invocation, the minutes were read and approved.

Committee Reports.

Monetary and Fiscal.

House Bill #8 and House Bill #10 were approved in committee. The chairman asked all organizations to submit future expenses for convention plans. Ten bills in the amount of \$4,140.61 have passed the House. Six bills have passed both the House and Senate for a total of \$3,251.48. The balance left out of \$15,000 is \$11,748.52.

Certification and Installation.

New members were sworn in. Charlotte Ben, Beta Lambda, was removed for excessive absences. (3 successive)

Process and Procedure.

House Rules are ineffective. Recommendations for their revision will be made over the Christmas holidays.

International Student Relations.

A statement of policy for the committee was given.

Old Business.

Sue Friedman presented the second reading of House Bill #10 concerning Cougar Christmasland in the amount of \$300. Bill was passed.

House Bill #8, Omicron Chi Epsilon was read for the second time. Motion was made for the passage. A motion was then made to accept the bill on condition that a group can receive money without representation in the House by Bob Pfister, was seconded and retracted. Joel Bergen moved that the bill be tabled. Motion passed for tabling the bill.

New Business.

International Student Relations Committee moved that a student roster be made up to help foreign students register. Motion seconded. Motion to table the bill failed. Motion passed.

Larry Newman presented the first reading of House Bill #11 for Kappa Alpha Mu. The bill was for \$289.70 for convention expenses.

Announcements.

Dorm activities bill died in committee. The next meeting will be on the third Monday in January, January 8, 1962. A motion was made by Frances Brownlee to adjourn. The motion failed. Sue Friedman moved that the next meeting be held on January 8. Motion passed by 2/3 of the House.
