Dear Sir:

Referring to your letter of June 29, 1931,
I return herewith Policy Nos. 21643 and T-288673 of
The Atlas Assurance Company covering in the amount
of \$37,000.00 each on two story hollow tile stucco
building to be occupied as Nurses Home, Utility
Building and Pavilion situate Lots 2 and 3, Block 32,
Holman Addition, City of Houston.

The construction of these buildings was
completed on June 1, 1931, and Judge Moore approves
the changing of this insurance to fire coverage in
the amount of \$37,000.00 and tornado coverage in the
amount of \$22,500.00, both subject to the 80% and 50%
Co-insurance Clauses under the fire and tornado
insurance respectively. I also return invoice of
Fred S. James & Company for \$763.08 covering premiums,
the amount of which I assume will be adjusted when the
above changes have been placed in effect.
