DPMC receives awards for efforts on Battleship Texas

For their volunteer efforts in helping to restore the ailing battleship USS Texas to its former floating condition, DPMC and its employees recently were singled-out for awards.

On April 21 -- San Jacinto Day -- DPMC Manager **HANK BETTENCOURT** accepted on behalf of Complex employees a Certificate of Appreciation from the Texas Parks & Wildlife Dept.'s Battleship Texas Advisory Board.

Additionally, on April 28, at a special luncheon at DPMC, 19 employees received certificates recognizing their services in the refloating of the 73-year-old battleship, which has been berthed at San Jacinto State Park since 1953.

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At a special DPMC luncheon April 28 hosted by Complex Manager Hank Bettencourt, a group of Complex employees were honored with certificates recognizing their services in helping to refloat the 73-year-old battleship USS Texas. The Texas Parks & Wildlife Dept. awarded these and other DPMC and Shell employees for their efforts in restoring the former fighting ship, which has been moored at San Jacinto State Park since 1953.

DPMC health study reveals mortality rate lower than that of rest of U.S.

The overall mortality rate among Shell DPMC employees between 1948 and 1983 -- for all causes of death -- was a full 25 percent lower than that of the entire U.S. population.

That and other significant information is contained in a Shell-commissioned study whose findings were recently announced.

The result of five years of research, in which the long-term health records of some 6,831 DPMC employees and former employees were examined by a team of epidemiologists, the report also has established that:

* Deaths from cancer were 16 per-

cent lower than those of the U.S. population.

* Leukemia rates for the study group as a whole were 14 percent lower than those of the U.S. population.

Begun in 1983, the study was conducted by two Ph.D. researchers from the University of Pittsburgh School of Public Health, **GARY MARSH** and **P. ENTERLINE**, both specialists in epidemiology. Additionally, **PHILIP COLE, M.D., Ph.D.**, a third epidemiologist, was commissioned by Shell to make an independent review of the report. Cole, who is based at the University of Ala-

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bama, concurred with its findings.

According to Dr. **BARRY KERN**, DPMC medical director, the study was commissioned to better understand the general health implications of working in a large refinery and chemical-producing facility.

"The Deer Park Complex was chosen for the study because it has many processes and operations common to other Shell facilities," Kern observes, "and because it has the largest number of employees at any one Shell petrochemical manufacturing plant."

According to Kern, the study included hourly operations, maintenance and staff employees who were potentially exposed to petrochemicals. It also included an update on employees who worked in the Isopropyl Alcohol (IPA) manufacturing areas of the chemical plant. Employees who worked at the

Complex for at least three months between 1948 and 1972 were included; mortality experience was followed through 1983.

"It's important to know that the main findings of the study are good ones," Kern observes. "It did not show any definite connection between any fatal disease and working at DPMC. Even cancer was below the average for the general population. As a whole, DPMC employees are healthy people."

He added that the investigators did report a slight excess number of cases in several disease categories that warrant further study.

"For example," he points out, "certain diseases, including malignant tumors involving the lymphatic and blood-forming tissues, were observed to be associated with either the time period in which a person was employed or how long the person was employed. These

findings are of specific interest and will be pursued further."

Kern says at present, it is not possible to determine whether these findings are due to chance, lifestyle factors such as smoking, or to specific exposures.

"We intend to keep employees informed as to the results of the follow-up and any new information which might become available from it," he adds.

The study findings tell DPMC employees that they generally have good health and a lower-than-expected incidence of cancer.

"Part of the reason is that we have excellent medical benefits plans and an excellent health and safety program" says Kern, "and we use them to keep ourselves well."

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teered their talents and expertise to the removal of old fuel oil and water from the fuel tanks of the former fighting ship last fall. These efforts rendered her able to be moved to drydock for massive repairs.

Shell Oil Co. and its subsidiaries have joined other local companies in the restoration project, which will involve five separate phases during the

next several years. Once refitted, the historic vessel will be returned to the

park berth at which it has been moored for more than 40 years.

Quality Commitments

Due to the broad departmental scope within Logistics, which covers operations throughout the entire Complex, a two-part story was necessary to cover how the Quality Process is working in that Business Area. Part I dealt with operations at the Docks and in Customer Services. Part II deals with Utilities and Environmental Operations.

With Quality training nearing completion for operating employees in Environmental and Utilities, a number of substantial upcoming projects to be tackled by the Utilities and Environmental Operations areas stand to benefit significantly from application of that training.

Operations Superintendent **BOB FARRAR** says the timing of completion of training fits well with startup of a plan to consolidate Utilities departments and a project to computerize the entire Utilities organization under one control system.

What's more, employees apparently are taking their Quality training to the job -- and using it often.

"Quality training already has resulted in employees taking interest in and recommending solutions to problems, rather than just repairing things," says Farrar. "Today, they're setting requirements, and that's directly attributable to the Quality Process."

An ongoing list of Corrective Action Team (CAT) projects, many of them taken on as part of Quality training, have resulted in measurable gains in planning, equipment reliability, on-stream time, operating efficiency and environmental compliance, says Farrar.

He tipped his hat to the group of certified Shell Quality Instructors in Logistics who, he adds, have used their own teaching skills to good advantage during the training. The group, which consists of **JIMMY SHELTON**, operator, who once taught in Deer Park Schools; **BILL WHITE**, electrician, who is a training officer in the U.S. Army Reserve; **CHET SERVANCE**, boiler-

maker, a former NASA employee and veteran, and both **ANGELO PULIDO**, craftsman and **BOB LEEZER**, docks operator, formed an outstanding cadre of instructors, Farrar says.

"This instructor team, operating under the supervision of **ADAM LE-COMPTE**, Utilities Systems field manager, are to be congratulated on the job they've done," Farrar observes.

Farrar says the people in Environmental Operations also are managing to apply the Quality Process in reducing solid waste costs, even with the additional burden of directing \$30 million in projects designed to keep DPMC in compliance with RCRA requirements.

"This business is changing so quickly that we're having to work smarter in anticipating changes that reduce our flexibility in the solid waste area," says Farrar.

Nowhere is this understanding more evident, he adds, than in Environmental Operations.

"The Quality Process is being used to help improve environmental operations throughout the Complex," says Farrar.

The overall safety record of Logistics personnel is outstanding, he adds, "and lost-time accidents have virtually disappeared" since introduction of the Quality Process. What's more, Logistics had a 99% attendance factor during 1987. "More than 50% of our 350 or so employees were at work 100% of the time."

Adam LeCompte says a number of Quality projects have served the Utilities area well.

"An obvious one has been the reliability increases brought about in steam generation," says LeCompte. "Currently, we have gone in excess of one year without a steam curtailment to any of the DPMC process units."

This, he says, is attributable to increased reliability of boiler feed water pumps. The increased reliability, he notes, resulted from better training, more precise operating and maintenance procedures, and more specific materials specification -- all due to application

of the Quality Process. In addition to himself, says LeCompte, a CAT formed to determine the problems involved and make recommendations on improving pump reliability was made up of **R.L. HARRISON**, operations supervisor; **D.E. MARSHALL**, operator, and **C.F. JESS**, rotating equipment engineer.

The team discovered that gaskets used to repair the pumps often were "surplus" ones, substituted for specified gaskets. They failed often. Additionally, repair personnel did not have vendor drawings on hand to use during repair.

"More than a few times, the pumps came back either with more parts than they came with, or fewer," says LeCompte. "It was assumed that the repair people just 'knew' how to repair the pumps. That was not the case."

The team recommended formal material specifications be used in pump repair, and that vendor drawings be made available to all repair sites.

"As a result, surveillance has in-

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creased and craftsmen and operators have been able to identify minor problems that, if left undetected, might have resulted in major pump breakdowns," says LeCompte. "Now, the pumps are not failing every four to six weeks, as they did before introduction of the Quality Process. With preventive maintenance, they should stay in service for four or five years." He said savings in reduced boiler feed water pump failures amounts to more than \$270,000 annually.

MIKE MARTIN, manager of Logistic Maintenance, noted that as part of Quality training, a CAT team discovered the root cause of a substantial number of pump failures on condensate storage tanks near the road between OP-II and Utilities Central.

The team, made up of **D.B. GARRIGA**, **C. OGILVIE**, **A.P. DELOS SANTOS** and team leader **L. KIMBLE**, determined that dust from the gravel/shell road contributed to the mechanical failure of the pumps by fouling bearings, bushings and seals.

"The team determined that by paving the road with asphalt, cutting down on dust, they could reduce pump failure

considerably," says Martin. "As a result, the savings in pump repair and replacement has long since paid for the paving work recommended by the CAT exercise."

BILL CHARLES, manager of Utilities Consolidation mentions the Quality Process being used to reduce rework on the lime slaking system, which has broken down for various reasons during the year due to lime buildup. A CAT was formed consisting of Team Leader **P.L. HARP**, maintenance relief foreman, **J.A. DAVIS**, area maintenance foreman; **K.L. HARWICK**, inspector foreman, **W.D. TESCHENDORF**, boilermaker, maintenance, and **H.D. STONE**, machinist, maintenance. "The team helped solve some problems early, and at low cost," says Charles.

An operations CAT is studying a slaker operational problem which impacts clarified water quality when slakers are switched, he says. The team's charter is to determine the cause of water quality degradation and to recommend corrective action."

TOM BURNETT, field team production manager, Utilities, points out that a CAT contributed directly to re-

ducing mechanical seal failures on pyrolysis pitch pumps that supply fuel to boilers.

The team was made up of **ED MULLERY**, area engineer, **J.D. MIMS**, boiler operator at OP-II, **L.N. BARRINGTON**, mechanical inspector/foreman, and **CHARLES SIMS**, a representative of the seal vendor, John Crane Co. The CAT, says Burnett, determined that the seals failed due to out-of-sequence pump startup procedures, an inadequate oil flush cooling system for the seals, and misalignment of the seals after cold startup due to heat expansion.

"The team came up with a more efficient oil-flushing system and formalized a set of startup sequence procedures consistent for all operators," says Burnett. "Seal reliability has been extended far beyond the 2-1/2-month average experienced before the Quality Process, to greater than one year."

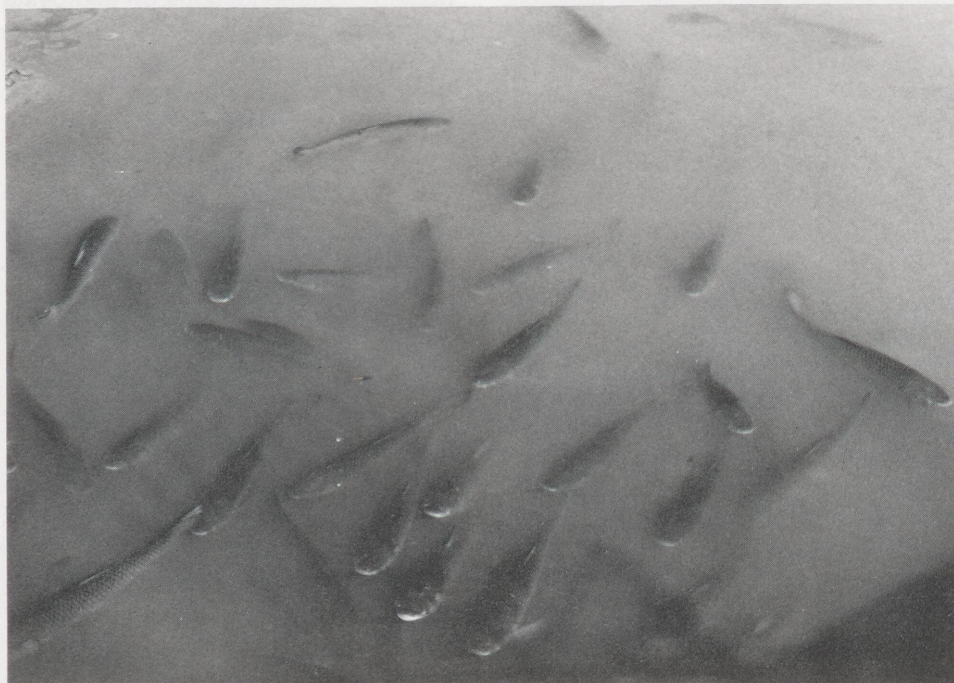
In Environmental Operations activities, **STEVE LEACH**, manager, and **JOHN WOODS**, operations supervisor, say the Quality Process is being applied to a number of projects, including development of plans to implement the most recent new requirements of the Resource Conservation & Recovery Act of 1976 (RCRA), which calls for additional regulations in handling and disposal of solid waste throughout the United States. At DPMC, projects to satisfy these new (1984) requirements already total some \$30 million in capital expenditures.

However, says Leach, Environmental Operations has formed various CATs to work on solutions to ongoing problems.

For example, a team made up of Woods, **HELEN HICKS**, secretary, and **STEVE RUFF**, distribution analyst, is working on a system to make environmental statistics more available to people in the field, Woods points out.

"The idea is to send computer files via modem to designated personal computers in each business area," says Woods. "This will keep everyone up-

Supplies, parts 'come to you' at Complex' full-service warehouse

During the next few months, DPMC employees will be attending training meetings and learning about a new and important change to warehouse operations.

HANK BETTENCOURT, Complex manager, introduces this new change in a video tape entitled: "The Full-Service Warehouse". He explains that this type of system has been used with great success at other Shell locations, and similar systems are being put to good use by our competitors.

"Also," says Bettencourt, "the Full-Service Warehouse is a crucial step towards improving the effectiveness of our workforce, which will result in increased competitiveness of the Deer Park Complex."

According to **DON DOZIER**, manager, Materials Management, the warehouse's slogan is "Let the Warehouse Come to You."

"And that's exactly what is happening," says Dozier, "with the warehouse delivering the materials to its clients."

Before the new system, Dozier recalls, users in need of materials had to stop work and go to a warehouse location to pick them up.

"With the new Full-Service Warehouse System," Dozier explains, "all that will change. In effect, the warehouse will come to you instead of you going there. Simply stated: You order your material requirements over the

phone or by computer and the material is delivered to you. Either case eliminates the need to stop work for a trip to and from the warehouse."

Another important aspect of using the Full-Service Warehouse are the zone stores, Dozier adds. A number of new zone stores have been added to those that already exist throughout the Complex. In some cases, new line items have been added. The zone stores have common "small stores" materials

and are located near the user and the job site.

But there's more, he continues.

"To ensure the accuracy of catalog descriptions, a CAT was formed in June 1987 to review the catalog descriptions of stock materials regularly stored in the warehouse," he relates. "As a result, each of the more than 50,000 individual items stocked at the warehouse is in the process of being re-

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dated with the latest environmental information in their area, which they can use as a basis for improving environmental performance."

Additionally, according to Leach, a special CAT was formed recently to recommend ways to improve the quality of storm water flow into both Patrick's Bayou and the Houston Ship Channel through storm outfalls. The team is made up of **N.A. GILBERT**, environmental supervisor; **L.I. RILEY**, **D.S. SMITH** and **S. GUERRERO**,

operating supervisors, Fuels; and **W.D. MARRIOT**, operating supervisor, Lubes.

This team is working on ways to prevent oil and grease contamination of storm water on its way to the outfalls.

A CAT also was formed to solve a pH problem at Outfall R-001, says Leach. **GREG GRANNEN**, TSO, Utilities South, and **STEVE GRESHAM** led the effort.

"Existing pH indication was inadequate and resulted in an environmental

exceedance and several near-misses," Leach notes. "The team installed a new pH indicator/controller. The control scheme is instrumented to close the outfall gate if the pH should approach either upper or lower limits.

"Additionally, the control scheme automatically starts pumps to recycle the effluent until it is within the acceptable limits."

Since the project was completed, he said, there have been no further pH exceedances.

Complex full-service warehouse comes to you

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viewed and its folio description updated."

Dozier observes that current use of the centralized material Order Desk system, which went on steam last August, is helping to phase-in the Full-Service Warehouse System. "We calculated a slow, deliberate movement into the new system because we didn't want our implementation to interfere with the needs of our 'customers,'" he points out. "That's why we introduced the Order Desk system and took the time to create the video tape, which will be shown to everyone in the Complex."

Additionally, he said, a Computer-Base Tutorial (CBT) was developed to train user about how to use paper catalogs, the on-line stock catalog, inventory systems, the material order system, auto-issue, and the delivery system.

"Training meetings will be held to instruct all DPMC employees about the future warehouse operations prior to implementation next January," Dozier says, "when the North Warehouse will be closed. These meetings will be conducted by BA Purchasing and Materials personnel and will provide the opportunity for users to ask questions and learn more specifics of the system."

A new delivery priority system also has been designed, Dozier adds. Low-priority material (i.e., gloves, stationery, coveralls, etc.), characterized as

Priority 24, will be delivered in 24 hours, he said. More crucial orders, with same-day delivery requirements, are designated Priority 2, and will be delivered within two hours.

"Priority 1 is given to material that is required to keep a unit running or when work is stopped until the material is delivered," he relates. "This priority has an objective delivery of 60 minutes or less to any point in the Complex."

All this, he observes, without anyone having to drop everything for a trip to the warehouse. Large or small, heavy or light in weight, the needed parts or equipment will be delivered either to the actual site of need or to the appropriate delivery stop location, and within the time specified by the priority number assigned to it.

However, Dozier adds, to assure that any materials-related problems are tackled immediately, a special "Materials Management Performance Survey" was created as part of the Quality Improvement Process.

"This sheet is available for notifying Materials Management of any real or potential nonconformances," he says.

Dozier emphasizes the importance of preplanning as much warehouse ordering as possible. Planning priorities, he says, will assist the warehouse

greatly.

"This type of assistance is a key to the efficient operation of the delivery system," says Dozier, "and the warehouse will operate more efficiently. What's more, we will be able to provide overall quicker service to you, our clients."
