Dear Sir:-

Your letter of June 12th received, together with telegram dated June fifteenth reading as follows:

"Mr. Sullivan requests return of pencil sketches on hospital mailed you last Thursday."

These communications came on the eve of Mr. Cullinan's leaving for his trip to the West Coast. He understood your telegram to mean that some revision of the sketches was contemplated. Partly on this account and partly through lack of time, he did not study the sketches closely, but asked me to say that as far as he was qualified to determine they were quite satisfactory; hence, if after getting the benefit of Dr. Slaughter's ideas or the opinion of others whose judgment based on experience would qualify them to pass on the practical features that enter, he could see no reason why they should not be traced and prints made that might be considered as final with exception of such changes as might develop when estimates of cost have been developed.

Mr. Cullinan understands that the entrance shown in the center of the ground plans is a walk only and not a driveway. In connection with this, he is of the opinion that it should show gates but it may be found that such will have to be closed in order to prevent its being used as a passageway by people living at each side of the hospital property.

Mr. Cullinan further desired to remind Mr. Sullivan regarding the importance of developing a suitable window.
