Chevy Chase, near Washington, D. C., is the scene of much studying of the art of "preparedness." There, on May 1, President Wilson opened the camp of the National Service School for Women. Three hundred women who are prominent in the social life at the national capital, have donned khaki and like their big brothers in the military preparedness camp are studying the things which, should the time ever come when our country will be involved in

war, will place them in a position to be of great service. The women will learn food conservation, signal work, wireless and plain telegraphy, first aid, hygiene and other valuable aids. The photograph shows some of the 300 women receiving their instructions.
