

Complex will host CIMA fire drill

Hundreds of firefighters and dozens of pieces of fire-fighting equipment from industries all along the ship channel will gather at the Complex next Tuesday. And they will be joined by a Coast Guard helicopter and boat, a Life Flight helicopter and the Port of Houston fire boat.

What is bringing all these folks together is the annual fire drill sponsored by Channel Industries Mutual Aid (CIMA). It's a group composed of more than 80 industries—including

Shell—and governmental groups in the ship channel area which share their resources when a member of CIMA has a fire or another emergency.

The drill, which begins at 9 a.m., is designed to test the preparedness of the personnel and equipment of CIMA members at Complex fire training grounds. The exercise will have all the characteristics of a real fire, with CIMA firefighters putting out several petrochemical blazes. There also will be several simulated rescues, with

some of the victims being "dispatched" to Hermann hospital by Life Flight after they have been "treated" at the Complex Dispensary.

But because of the large amounts of traffic that will be coming up Refinery Road shortly before the exercise begins and after it ends at 11:20 a.m., employees are being asked to use other routes to leave and enter the Complex if possible. Refinery Road traffic will be directed by Harris County Sheriff's deputies and Complex Security guards.
