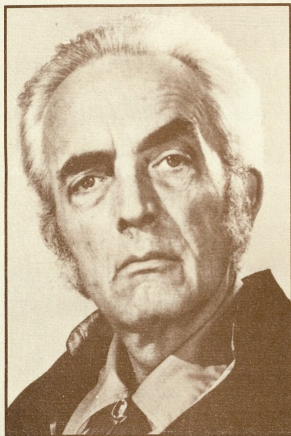

**TOGETHER AGAIN. . .** FRITZ LEIBER and Harry Fischer lead you into an adventure of the world of fantasy, March 19, 20, and 21 in Clarksburg, West Virginia.



**FRITZ LEIBER**

A three day symposium featuring the renowned Fritz Leiber, a leading American writer of science fiction, supernatural horror, and heroic fantasy stories for over thirty years, is being sponsored by the Friends of the Library and the Writing Department of the Art Center.

Two of Leiber's characters, Fafhrd and the Gray Mouser, are heroes created during the depression years by Clarksburg resident, Harry Otto Fischer. Fischer's contribution to Leiber's work is acknowledged in each of his publications. And while Mr. Fischer has been the guest of fantasy conferences around the country, few people realize he lives in West Virginia.

Among his many awards, Fritz Leiber has won the Hugo Award of the World Science Fiction Convention six times; the Nebula Award of the Science Fiction Writers of America three times; the Lovecraft World Fantasy Award and the August Derleth Award of the British Fantasy Society. He was the 1979 American Guest of honor at the World Science Fiction Convention in Brighton, England. In addition to his writing, his mobiles and "splatter-stencil" drawings have won art awards at two world science fiction conventions.

## **THERE'S MORE. . .**

Not only will you meet and talk with Fritz Leiber, alias Fafhrd, and Harry Fischer, alias the Gray Mouser, you will see films, slide shows, demonstrations of computer war games, and a fantasy art exhibit; you will attend receptions; and you will participate in panel and group discussions led by academic humanists.
