SUMMER SENATE

The second meeting of the Student Association Summer Senate was called to order by the PRESIDENT X at 6:15 p.m. in Room 204 of the Cougar Den building at the University of Houston. Miss TRUEHART and Mr. DRISCOLL were present. Mr. O'QUINN was absent.

EXECUTIVE REPORT

STATUS OF BILLS

The PRESIDENT announced that S. 15, the budget bill, had been approved by the Dean of Students, William Yardley. He also stated that S. 7, the bill concerning the swimming pool, had been referred to the Student Services Fee Allocation Advisory Committee for recommendations to President Hoffman. If approved, the bill would come into effect within a year, possibly by next summer.

HOUSTON COUNCIL OF COLLEGES

the PRESIDENT reported that the Houston Council of Colleges had met over the weekend, and that it was up to the University of Houston to initiate the Student Discount Service, if it is to be operational by fall.

The PRESIDENT explained that the first \$500 taken in by ~~WNS~~ each of the sponsoring schools was to go to the Houston Council of Colleges. After that, the individual Student Governments would be able to retain 10¢ for each dollar discount card sold. The money received by the Houston Council of Colleges would be used to cover expenses, to pay the director, and as commissions to individuals responsible for securing accounts for the service. The discount rate granted would vary among the participating businesses. The pay for students involved in organizing the discount service would not be available until November, although the work would have to be completed by September.

He requested that Mr. DRISCOLL submit to him ~~MA~~ a report on the availability of early registration permits to students not on the employ of the university.

Mr DRISCOLL moved that the Summer Senate adjourn. There being no further business, the Summer Senate adjourned at 6:47 p.m. subject to call.
