in the penalty of two thousand dollars, conditioned
for entering in the District Court of the United
States for the District of Texas, at the next term
thereof on the first day of its next session,
copies of the process and proceedings against him
as aforesaid, and also for his appearance in
said Court, and your petitioner now prays your
honor in pursuance of the act of Congress in
such case made and provided, to remove said
suit so commenced, for trial from
this Court to the next District
Court of the United States for the District

of Texas aforesaid and your petitioner as in
