THIRD OFFER

Wednesday morning, January 23rd, DPMC representatives made a third negotiating proposal to members of OCAW Local 4-367. Offered was a 40 cents per hour wage increase, over the previously agreed upon 5 percent increase. Also proposed was a \$12 increase in the company-paid portion of employee and family medical insurance and a \$3 increase in employee only insurance. This brings the company-paid subsidies for this insurance to \$96 per month for employee/family coverage and \$33 per month for employee only coverage.
