Dear Sir:

This owns receipt of yours of February 16th.

On further consideration, I believe a pole of equal height of the main building would answer all purposes, and suggest that you now draw specifications for such pole, including the foundation, and re-submit to me before securing a bid.

As there should be no great difference in the cost between a 30 ft. and 50 ft. pole as the labor and foundation would be substantially the same, it might be well to prepare specifications on each, to be located as previously suggested at the intersection of the walks following the plan suggested in the second paragraph of your letter of February 9th.

This raises a further question about location of the drinking fountains, one of which should be in or near the pavilion and the other near the nurses home. Could you see any objection to placing such in the center of the pavilion and in the center line of the walk extending north from the nurses home a few feet north of the latter and before the walk narrows. Adopting this plan would place such in the afternoon shade in each case.
