PUTTING TEETH INTO THE ISSUE

At a meeting held Saturday, February 2, at Wood River, company representatives at that location offered the following improvement to the package previously proposed:

The company will provide an optional dental assistance plan within 30 days following settlement of the current negotiations. For employees who enroll in this new plan, the company will contribute \$4 per month for family coverage toward the total premium.

The other company provisions offered in settlement at Wood River are the same as those currently on the table at Deer Park. At this time, there are no scheduled meetings between DPMC and OCAW Local 4-367 representatives. TEAMSTERS SETTLE

Shell has reached agreement with two Teamsters local unions in the Chicago area ending a 55-day strike involving some 73 employees at the company's Argo, Des Plaines, and East Chicago distribution plants. The Shell employees returned to work January 31. The major issue in the Teamster strike was driver-loading of tank trucks. As part of the settlement, drivers will begin loading on May 1, after familiarizing themselves with driver loading techniques.
