Hydrocracking receives new award

Hydrocracking operators and others associated with the department were recognized for their recent efforts at making their units among the most reliable in DPMC's fuels business.

Early this year, a recognition award — "The Rock of Reliability" — was

created by Fuels business management. Its purpose is to call attention to departments displaying the best overall reliability during a quarter. The award is ongoing and will be presented to a Fuels department each quarter.

The first department to receive the

award was Hydrocracking. "We had an outstanding first quarter this year," says GWEN TAYLOR, Hydrocracking process manager. "The three units — SHCU, SR-5 and HP-1 — demonstrated their reliability at a time when they were badly needed."

At the end of the first quarter, the Selective Hydrocracking Unit (SHCU) completed a year with a stream factor of 98.1 percent — its highest ever. The unit makes high quality gas oil feed which it supplies to Olefins as well as high quality naphthas for CR-3 and Plat-2 feedstock.

"SHCU's high stream factor helped these units perform well," Gwen points out. She adds that the high stream factors of other units -- especially CR-3 and the Sats Gas Plant -- had an impact on SHCU's performance.

In February and early March, sulfur recovery unit SR-5 handled all sulfur removal from sour crude entering DPMC since the other sulfur recovery units, SR-3 and SR-4, were down for maintenance.

"The entire Complex was riding on SR-5 during this time," Gwen explains. "The unit came through with its usual high level of performance."

Another Hydrocracking unit whose first quarter reliability was outstanding is HP-1. "This unit makes hydrogen and supplies it to other units, such as SHCU, CFH, DHT, HDU-1, HDU-2,

Royal Dutch stock fund

Effective June 1, 1987, Provident Fund members may direct that FUTURE company contributions to their Provident Fund account be invested in shares of Royal Dutch Petroleum Company stock.

This new investment alternative is in addition to the existing Equities Fund and Thrift Fund. Members may direct that the company's future contributions be invested on their behalf in the Thrift Fund, Equities Fund or

Royal Dutch Stock Fund in multiples of 25 percent.

The new Royal Dutch Stock Fund operates the same way that the "old" Shell Stock Fund operated. This is described on pages 40-42 of "Your Retirement Program" in the SHELL AND YOUR BENEFIT PLANS booklet.

Complex crews participate

CAER team stages mock disaster

The City of Deer Park's Community Awareness and Emergency Response (CAER) team recently staged a simulated transportation disaster near DPMC. Emergency response crews from the Complex participated in the drill along with eighteen other city and industry groups.

Representatives from the city and local industry make up the CAER team. Representing DPMC are **TOM GILLESPIE**, HS&E superintendent; **B. T. WAGGONER**, Health & Safety manager; **PETER FISCHER**, Community Relations manager; and **CHUCK VASEK**, senior safety inspector. In his capacity as mayor of Deer Park, DPMC Maintenance Supervisor Jimmy Burke is chairman of the CAER team.

The CAER disaster drill, which took place June 25, was put on to test the community's and surrounding industries' ability to effectively respond

to a transportation emergency involving a chemical spill or leak.

In the drill's scenario, a tank truck carrying a simulated load of chemicals was to have collided with a train at the westbound Highway 225 feeder road and DPMC dock road intersection. Smoke cartridges were set off to simulate chemical gases escaping from the railway tank car.

At this point, emergency response groups from the cities of Deer Park and Pasadena, the Harris County Sheriff's office, and nearby industries were called upon for assistance. DPMC's fire crew sprayed water on the accident site while representatives from the Complex's Industrial Hygiene department monitored the area for noxious gases.

Houston-area news media covered the drill, which was deemed a success by its organizers.

In a separate recent event, the Deer Park CAER team co-sponsored

a Household Hazardous Materials Day in Deer Park. Residents of the city were able to safely and easily dispose of their hazardous household chemicals such as painting supplies and varnish at a local site. DPMC donated "Hazardous Wastes From Homes" booklets for the event.

If a member does not wish to participate in the Stock fund at this time, nothing needs to be done.

If a member decides to direct company contributions to purchase Royal Dutch stock and later decides to sell some or all of the shares, the member can transfer the proceeds from the sale to the Equities Fund and/or the Thrift Fund. Like the old Shell Stock fund, however, a member cannot transfer this money back into the Royal Dutch Stock Fund at a later date.

MS&H, HT-2, HT-3, LHT-1, LHT-2, Phenol and SSU," Gwen says. "HP-1 operated at high capacity during the first quarter in order to replace the hydrogen so that they could continue operating as planned."

Hydrocracking Operator **ROBERT BENEDICT** says one reason the units were able to operate reliably was that their instrumentation and electronics were checked on a regular basis. "If there were any potential problems, they were corrected before they became real ones," he points out.

Operator **ALAN SHEPPARD** also believes that equipment reliability played a major part in the overall reliability of the units. "All the equipment ran trouble-free," he explains. "If you can operate a unit for a long period of time without any maintenance shutdowns, you've got a good chance of making gains in your output." Capitol improvement projects recently were completed within Hydrocracking to improve reliability of the units.

As with all operations, good communication is an important factor in ensuring reliability of the units. "We

worked closely with other operators to make the correct moves," says Operator **JIM DAVIS**. "When you have product coming in and going out at the same time, knowing what the other units are doing is essential."

This communication and cooperation between operators is extended to maintenance craftsmen, the engineering functions and Economics & Scheduling personnel. "Although having reliable equipment is important, having skillful, conscientious operators, craftsmen and other related personnel is equally important, if not more so," says **CHARLIE THOMPSON**, operations supervisor for Hydrocracking.


As with all other units at DPMC, the Hydrocracking units have a direct impact on the performance potential of the entire Complex. "In varying degrees, we all depend on the other units," Gwen explains. "By avoiding unscheduled shutdowns, off-spec production or below-program throughput, the other units have a better chance of achieving high levels of production.

"Operating DPMC at its optimum is truly a Complex team effort," she says.

Memories needed as 75th approaches

Shell Oil will celebrate its 75th year in September, and you can play a part.

Exactly 75 years ago this year, the American Gasoline Company, one of the two predecessors of Shell Oil Company, made the first sale of Shell gasoline in this country.

In mid-September 1912, a Royal Dutch/Shell tanker unloaded a cargo of gasoline from Sumatra at a new Shell terminal near Seattle.

On October 4, the first sale was made -- a railroad tank-car load to an agent in Chehalis, Washington. At that time, the American Gasoline Company employed just over 20 people.

Simultaneously, a half-dozen people 2,000 miles away in Tulsa, Oklahoma, were getting Shell's other

predecessor, the Roxana Petroleum Company, a small crude oil producing company, off the ground.


Much has happened in the 75 years since these two companies began doing business -- especially at DPMC.
