Dear Sir:

This confirms understanding from you that fire and tornado insurance on the nurses home, utility building and pavilion, arranged for through Fidelity Trust Company with Fred S. James & Company, is to be cancelled and the business placed with the firm of Houston and Tyler who will look to Dr. J. W. Slaughter and yourself in working out the details.

Mr. Pat Houston and Mr. Louis Stevenson called on me yesterday in regard to such change. They will procure and deliver to me the two Atlas Assurance Company policies, Nos. 21697 and T288717 covering fire and tornado respectively, which I forwarded by registered mail to the Houston Negro Hospital on May 27, 1932, together with invoice covering premium. When such policies are delivered to me I will return them to Fred S. James & Company stating (suggested by Mr. Houston) that the Houston Negro Hospital decided they did not want them. Mr. Houston said he would try to handle satisfactorily any attempt by Fred S. James & Company to cancel the policies at short term rates. The policies are for a term of one year and expire April 30, 1933.
