The second meeting of the twentieth session of the UHSA Senate was called to order in the Atlantic Room by President Steve Parker at 7.00 p.m.

Absent were Senators Dealey, Royston, and Bishop.

President Parker inducted those Senators who were absent from last week's Senate meeting.

President Parker requested nominations from the floor for the position of Speaker of the Senate. Senator Mason nominated Senator Pat Condon who was unanimously approved.

The minutes from last week's meeting were presented and approved.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Vice President Cheryl Phillips announced that she will be looking forward to working with the Committees and that her hours will be posted early this week.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer Robert Bartkowiak distributed FY'83 Students' Association Budget and Maintenance & Operations Expense Status reports for review by the Senators. He explained that the fiscal year runs from September 1 through August 31 so that upon notice from the Students' Service Fee Allocation Committee's of our allocated funds, we should be able to devise our new budget sometime around the end of August or first of September.

SPEAKER'S REPORT

Speaker Pat Condon announced that he will post office hours sometime this week. He will be ordering name tags and name plates for each of the Senators soon.

The floor was given to Ms. Connie Wallace, Assistant Vice Chancellor, Associate Dean of Students, who described her role in the University, to the Students' Association as a whole, and to the Senators as representatives of the student body.

Robert Lusk, previous Speaker of the Students' Association, gave a presentation on the path of a bill and the various types of bills handled by the Students' Association.

Kevin Lacobie, as Director of Academic Affairs and previous Senator, discussed parliamentary procedure and its use in Senate Meetings.

Matt Woodruff then described his role as Attorney General of the Students' Association.

Speaker Pat Condon moved that the Senate recess at 8:25 p.m.

The Senate was Called to Order again at 8:45 p.m.

FISCAL AND GOVERNMENTAL

President Parker introduced Senate Bill 29001 to allocate funds for the Cougar Blast held last week. Discussed and approved.

CAMPUS GOVERNANCE

President Parker's appointments to his cabinet and nominations to the Senators-at-Large positions were discussed. Senator Chapman moved that the issue be tabled at present in order for more information to be given to each of the Senators regarding these appointments. Senator Mason disagreed, stating that Parker has chosen who he can best work with and unless there are some damaging information regarding the character of these Senators, then the appointments should be approved as they are. Further scrutiny into these Senators filling the Senator-at-Large positions would, however, be in order. The Motion to Table then failed. Advice and Consent Motions were made to each of the appointments and nominations to at-Large positions were passed. New Senators Barnes and Condon were sworn in and Barnes appointed to the University Policy Board. Other positions left open because of cabinet appointments will be filled upon recruitment efforts be Vice President Cheryl Phillips.
