The Senate met at 7:10 p.m. in Oberholtzer Hall in Dining Rooms 3 and 4, and the President called the meeting to order.

The Vice President and twenty-six Senators were present, with the following Senators absent: MIKE DRISCOLL, BERT GONZALES, and SUSAN LOGAN.

SENATE JOURNAL

The minutes were approved as reported.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

President GAGHAGEN administered the oath of office to Phil Dagastino from the College of Optometry making the Senate complete.

The following appointments were made by the President to the Who's Who Commission, which were referred to the Committee On State, National & International Affairs:

President GAGHAGEN said that applications for Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities are available in the Student Association office. Students will have until December 5th to turn in their applications. The President urged the Committee to take immediate action in approving the nominations to the Who's Who Commission.

The President also nominated Roger Priest for the editorship of Cougar Paw (referred to the Committee On Student Life) and Jeff Young for Director of Campus Events & Dances Division (referred to the Committee On Fiscal & Governmental Affairs).

The President reported that a T.I.S.A. Leadership Laboratory will be held on December 2, 3 and 4, at Baylor University. He asked Jack Heisler, Legislative Assistant, and Miss LOGAN to attend this Leadership Laboratory for the University. The President said that one other person is needed to attend this laboratory, and that if anyone is interested to contact him after the meeting or later in

the Student Association office.

President GAGHAGEN reported that the AWS bill is progressing favorably. The President along with Dean Yardley and Penny Smith, AWS President, met last week to discuss the bill. It was said at this meeting that the bill does come under the role of Student Government and the Advisory Committee will probably favor this proposal. Penny Smith said that she would take action herself with a recommendation to the committee and the issue will be resolved in the near future.

President GAGHAGEN asked for volunteers to attend the Safety and Security Conference to be held at the Rice Hotel on November 30th through December 1st, at 10:00 a.m. Mr. Sterling Baker requested four students to be on a panel to discuss related issues at this conference; Jim Evans and Mr. POSTON volunteered to attend. President GAGHAGEN said that there are still two more people needed to appear on this radio program along with Miss TRUEHEART.

President GAGHAGEN reported that positions are open for Student Representatives on the Religion Center Policy Board, and interested persons should apply. Larry Lusk is so far the only applicant nominated by the President.

President GAGHAGEN said that a Faculty Senate Luncheon is to be held on Tuesday, December 6, at 11:30 a.m. The Executive Committee is to be present. Miss COLLISTER and Mr. BAKER also volunteered to attend.

COMMITTEE ON RULES & JUDICIARY

Mr. DRISCOLL, Chairman, reported that the Committee met on November, 14, 1966. Everyone was in attendance and the Committee unanimously recommends that Floyd Gerry Armstrong be appointed as Second Alternate to the Traffic Appeals Board.

The Committee then agreed to meet again on Tuesday, November 15, 1966, at 6:00 p.m. in the Cougar Den. Due to a lack of a quorum, on this date, the Committee was unable to take action on the state of excused and non-excused absences for Senators.

COMMITTEE ON FISCAL & GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS

Vice President MATTERN, Chairman reported that his Committee met on November 16, 1966. The Committee approved George Hurlburt for the position of Director of Public Relations.

The appointee for Director of Campus Events and Dances, George Greene, has been withdrawn from consideration of the committee by the President, because he has assumed a 35-hour a week job and he felt that the time he had remaining would not justify him for this position.

Senate Bill #18 was discussed by both representatives from AWS and representatives from the Student Association. Various points of interest from both parties was brought out. The principle reason for this meeting, that of bringing both parties together for discussion of the bill, and hearing arguments from both parties was accomplished.

A meeting was also set up with Dean W. A. Yardley, Richard Gagghagen, and Penny Smith, President of AWS, to obtain Dean Yardley's ideas on the subject.

AWS had not at the date of this meeting received any correspondence from other Colleges concerning the allocation of funds to AWS.

The results of this meeting will be brought to the Committee this week and S. 18 will hopefully be brought out of Committee by the next meeting of the Senate.

OLD BUSINESS

After considering each candidate recommended by Committee, the Senate voted to confirm the following people: Gerry Armstrong (Second Alternate to the Traffic Appeals Board) and George Hurlburt (Public Relations Director).

Mr. THIEL moved to discharge S.18 from Committee. Mr. THIEL said that the bill is ready for action by the Senate because the bill comes under the authority of Student Association which was admitted by Dean Yardley, and that AWS will be given sufficient funds for their convention.

Miss LOESCH said that she would speak in behalf of AWS since she was on the Executive Committee of AWS. She said that the Committee has thoroughly discussed the bill and that it would be unfair to any organization represented to take action on this bill without notifying AWS.

Mr. GREENE moved the previous question. The motion to discharge S.18 failed with a vote of 2 in favor, 23 against.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. GREENE of Arts & Sciences announced that the Committee On State, National & International Affairs would meet after the meeting.

Vice President MATTERN announced that the Committee On Fiscal & Governmental Operations would meet after the meeting.

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. BAKER moved that the meeting adjourn. The motion was agreed to; and (at 7:50 p.m.) the Senate adjourned.
