Sometime during the first week in December ten tickets will be drawn and the winners will be given another pair of safety shoes -- absolutely free.



VISITING THE SICK FOR JESSE DRENON IS SIMPLY DOING WHAT HIS BIBLE TELLS HIM

"How's old so-and-so doin'?" is a familiar question to Jesse Drenon who spends a large portion of his off-hours time visiting the sick.

Jesse, who is a Swamper in the Automotive Department when he's not being his brother's keeper, says he was inspired by a Bible verse a long time ago and has lived by it ever since. The verse as he relates it from St. Matthew: "...I was sick and ye visited me... Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me."

Living up to this creed often requires two or three nights a week and Saturdays - plus a lot of 28¢ bus rides, because Jesse doesn't drive. This takes a thorough knowledge of Dreamliner routes and schedules because Jesse visits the homes as well as the hospitals. He says he's able to afford it "because I don't do no runnin' around except to see sick folks."




HIS BROTHER'S KEEPER...and more. Jesse Drenon checks the sick list before planning his evenings' visits.

Church work takes up most of the rest of what spare time Jesse has left, because he and his wife Eula Lee are mainstays in the Church of God in Christ on North Main. Jesse sings in the choir and in the Men's Chorus, while Eula Lee serves as President of the Young Woman's Club.

NATIONAL CITIZENSHIP TEST
PATTERNED AFTER SHELL'S DRIVER
TEST ON CBS TV NOVEMBER 9

Once again millions of Americans of all ages will participate in a nationwide television test. This one, which tests their knowledge of rights and responsibilities as citizens, will appear on CBS News' "The National Citizenship Test," Tuesday, November 9, at 9:00 P.M.

"The National Citizenship Test" is the first new audience involvement broadcast to be scheduled since the Shell-sponsored phenomenally successful National Drivers Test which was seen by an estimated 30,000,000 viewers, many millions of whom

took the test. CBS News Correspondents Harry Reasoner and Mike Wallace will be the reporters.

In addition to testing viewers' knowledge, "The National Citizenship Test" will question audience attitudes toward their privileges and responsibilities as citizens. The test also will question audiences about their knowledge of the workings of American government. The general presentation, sponsored by IBM, will be on the same format as the National Drivers Test.

In announcing plans for the broadcast, CBS News President Fred W. Friendly said that "while 'The National Drivers Test' intimately involved persons in matters of immediate life and death, 'The National Citizenship Test' undoubtedly is even more vital in terms of our long-range national survival."

"At this time in our history," Friendly said, "with continuing conflict and controversy at home as well as abroad, it is imperative that each and every American citizen be completely aware of his rights and the rights of all citizens."

Questions for "The National Citizenship Test," one of the series of alternate-Tuesday CBS News prime-time broadcasts have been prepared by CBS News in cooperation with the Educational Testing Service, Princeton, N.J.


WEEK END REMINDER



Retiree David M. Bergin, 54, died October 21, of an apparent heart attack. He was a native Houstonian and a graduate of North Texas State Teachers College. His early years at the Refinery were spent primarily in the Gas Department where, in 1942, he was promoted to Shift Foreman. Four years later, when the Effluent Control Department was established, he was named Assistant Manager. At the time of his retirement in 1961, Mr. Bergin was in his 27th year of service.
