## REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

President Gaghagen began his report by welcoming all the Senators back to the University and to the Senate. He explained that the Senate meetings will be held in Dining Rooms 3 and 4 until the new University Center is opened, and the Senate will resume its regular meeting time on Monday at 7:00 p.m. starting next week. The President reported that a summer report regarding Student Government will be typed up and distributed in the near future. The Student Association manual should be out by the next Senate meeting. This manual is a thirty-two page booklet describing every position in Student Government for the purpose of giving students a clear picture of what is expected of them when they hold a position in Student Association. The President then reported on the vacancies in different departments. The Senatorial vacancies are as follows:

The President said that he was in need of people to fill many positions including the following: Director of Personnel, Sound-Off Director, a student not from Law School for Student Court, and five students for the Lecture Artist Series.

President Gaghagen said that there are tentative plans made for Dr. Hoffman to speak to the Senate on October 24, and Dean Yardley to speak on October 3. The Student Life Division of the University has a meeting every two weeks discussing all matters concerning students. The President said that he would like to have two Senators attend with him at these meetings every other Tuesday at 10:00 to 12:00 a.m. The Senators able to participate at these meetings should give notice to the President as soon as possible. The President reported that money received from this year's budget should come to approximately \$55,000, including the money left over from the summer. The Treasurer, Alan Kipnis, is in the process of preparing a financial report on the spring semester and summer. Because the Student Association Budget had to be reduced, funds were not going to be available to finance the TISA Higher Education Conference and the Undergraduate Research Program. So President Gaghagen requested financial assistance from Dr. Hoffman this summer. Thus, during the summer funds were approved for the Undergraduate Research Program (\$1000.00) and the T.I.S.A. Higher Education Conference (whatever it costs--approximately \$300-400).

This summer David Amidon, Sonny Dotson, Tom Koebernick and President Gaghagen, along with Dr. Zwicky, Dean Whitehead and Mr. Bennett went to the Leadership Training Conference in Bethel, Maine. Mr. Bennett is still preparing a report which will be distributed to all the Senators. Jim Evans and the President attended the USNSA Conference and this report can be found in your folders and should be read by all Senators. Registration permits were secured for all Senators this fall, but the policy is still under review by the Administration. Student Association Advising Service was begun by Chris Moore for the purpose of offering some kind of service to students. This program is new is designed to be a service to help students. The Senate Award Certificates have arrived and will be given to last year's Student Association personnel as soon as possible. The President then made the following appointments: John Nichols, (reappointment) to the Student Court; Susan Tipton and Larry Sauer to the University Center Policy Board; Susan Watkins, Traffic Appeals Board; Marsha Bakst, Alternate for the Traffic Appeals

Board; Nancy Ainsworth, Director of Cougar Christmasland; and Bruce Beeler, Homecoming Director. These appointments were referred to the Committee On Rules & Judiciary. President Gaghagen reviewed and discussed the new Senate Standing Rules. After the discussion, Mr. Greene of Pharmacy moved to adopt the Senate Rules as presented. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. The Rules were referred to the Committee on Rules & Judiciary in order that they might further review and discuss the Standing Rules and have an opportunity to recommend any amendments at the next meeting. Miss Trueheart was appointed Chairman of the Committee on Student Life and the appointment was approved unanimously.

#### ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Driscoll asked to meet with the members of the Committee On Rules & Judiciary after the Senate meeting to arrange meeting time.

Mr. Greene of Arts. & Sciences announced a meeting of the Committee On Leadership Development and Community Welfare (now Committee On State, National and International Affairs) after the Senate meeting.

The President announced that the Student Association was bringing the Lettermen to the campus for a concert in November. He also reminded the Senators of the Senate meeting next week, Monday September 26, in Oberholtzer Hall, Dining Room 3 and 4, at 7:00 p.m.

Mr. Allan Soffar announced his resignation from the Senate due to lack of time because he is now writing his Master's thesis. He told the Senate that he enjoyed working with them and had high hopes for the progress to be made by this year's Senate.

Mr. Driscoll moved to permit Mr. Soffar to receive a Senate Award Certificate for his service in the 1966-67 session of the Senate in appreciation for his work in the Senate. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.
