Re: Hartford Policies Nos. 18414 & 6302

We are pleased to enclose the above policies covering, for a term of one year effective June 2, \$37,000.00 fire and \$22,500.00 windstorm insurance on the Nurses' Home and Utility Building of the Houston Negro Hospital, Incorporated.

We have prepared copies of these policies and are today forwarding them to the Fidelity Trust Company to Mr. Powell, as requested by them.

We have changed the wording of form from previous policies in order not to include any coverage on the pavilion.

You will note that the policies are written at the same rate and premium as those which were replaced. We have already made application to the Insurance Rating Department, in person, at their Houston office for reduction in fire rate and have been advised that it will be allowed. As required by law, we have used the existing published rate and will adjust the rate and premium on the fire policy, effective inception of the policy, to the new rate when promulgated. Accordingly, we suggest that you withhold the enclosed invoice pending revised invoice based on adjusted rate.
