My Dear Miss Young: I have your letter and I am delighted to know that I may expect some recipes especially for grits. This letter is some six weeks too late; nevertheless I enclose herewith two copies of recipes from Suffragists in different parts of the state, and a correction in the spelling of the word grits, which was purely a typographical error, and grits is still spelled grits in the South.

Do you know that Rhode Island and Massachusetts I am awfully sorry that Texas did not contribute her proper quota of the recipes for use of corn meal, but that was because we got very busy impeaching our governor just about that time, and it was so much more important than anything else we had in hand that we simply laid aside all other work. Twenty-one articles of impeachment have been charged by the House and presented to the Senate for trial, and we now await the outcome with interest and some anxiety. Meanwhile I am home for a few days catching up with all of the Suffrage work that has accumulated in my absence, because I expect to go back to Austin.
