If the alarm tone sounds throughout your floor, please proceed to the nearest stairwell and go down three floors. Re-enter that floor and await further instructions.

If you hear the alarm tone but it is not throughout your floor, remain where you are but be prepared to evacuate if you are instructed to do so.

Instructions will be made on the building speaker systems by emergency personnel.

Only use stairwells vacating your floor. Elevators will be immediately recalled to the main

lobby in case of an emergency and will not be available for passenger use.
