Dear sir:

Houston Negro Hospital has sent me, with the request that we keep the same for it, two fire insurance policies, both issued by American Central Insurance Company, one No. 9531 covering furniture and fixtures in Nurses' Home for \$2500.00 and expiring Sept. 4th, 1937, and the other No. 9549 covering the hospital building in the sum of \$75,000.00, expiring Dec. 17th, 1937. I enclose such policies to you for safekeeping in behalf of the hospital.

The trust agreement for the benefit of Houston Negro Hospital provides that the net income of the trust estate after payment of costs and expenses shall be paid over at convenient periodic intervals and at least semi-annually. I understand that after paying the service charge for the year 1937 at the rate of \$1.00 per month there remains on hand the sum of \$188.00, with no known expenses in sight for the remainder of the year 1937. In the absence of contrary instructions from others indicated hereon it will be in order to issue check for the cash balance payable to Houston Negro Hospital and mail the same to Mrs. W. R. Styron, 1110 Barkdull Street, Houston, Texas.
