Dear Mrs. Bryan:

I have received and greatly appreciate your letter of January 22nd, with reference to the Houston Negro Hospital.

Certainly, we will expect you to remain on the Advisory Committee, and will be glad when you are in position to attend our meetings.

It is an interesting work and we must not permit the erratic and undisciplined conduct of the negroes to discourage us. It is certainly worth the effort, and I have yet great confidence that we will be able to develop the institution along the lines desired by the donor and that we will be able to iron out matters with the negroes of the community and have them understand the unselfish efforts being put forth in their behalf. I am making an appeal direct to the negroes of Houston through a mass meeting Sunday afternoon at three o'clock.
