


and the children didn't have a park.


"more recreational programs," I said,


\* This <sup>Mr.</sup> Jones? I asked. - We listen

In 1959 the land where Magnolia Park was located on 80th St. was sold to the city for a freeway extension, leaving the boys of the Magnolia Pony League without a place to play. Mr. Zelmero envisioned again, to obtain land on Tipps + 75th for Mason Park #2, which was not being used.

Once again Mr. Z. asked me to go to a council meeting. <sup>2nd 4/20/60</sup> Mr. H. Creeper, R. Halquin + me myself were there. I told the Mayor + councilmen that the people from Magnolia P were good tax payers <sup>just</sup> as the ones in River Oaks, Shadyside + Westbury Park. + we desperately needed a park for older boys. The Pony League \* Today, Mason Park #2



has a baseball diamond, bleachers,  
water fountains & restrooms, & concession  
stand. Opening Game <sup>was</sup> 5/21/60

In Conclusion Mr. Zemene was an
