SENATE JOURNAL

APRIL 4, 1966

The fourth regular meeting of the Third Session of the Student Senate was called to order by President Gaghagen at 7:10 P.M. in Room 160 of the Lamar Fleming Building on April 4, 1966. There were twenty-three senators present and the following Senators were absent:

The minutes were approved as reported.

EXECUTIVE REPORT

President Gaghagen reported that the Executive Committee met that afternoon to approve the change of Ron Blackard from the Committee on Academic Affairs to the Committee of Fiscal and Governmental Operations. Vice President Mattern was appointed Chairman of the Committee of Fiscal and Governmental Operations and Senator Soffar was appointed to the Committee on Academic Affairs. The President then made the following appointments:

Bill Taylor - Chairman of Election Commission
John Mathews - Election Commissioner
Jim Evans - Attorney General
Nancy Ainsworth - Traffic Appeals Board

These appointments were referred to the Committee on Rules and Judiciary for approval. The President read a "Letter to the Editor" from the Daily Cougar of October 1, 1965, concerning Senate Bill No. 1. President Gaghagen announced that the Student Association Banquet was postponed again to May 19, due to the possibility of obtaining a special speaker for the Banquet. The President also announced that the next Senate meeting will be held on April 18, which will be the Monday following the Easter holidays. The

President reported that the University Center Board had decided against charging the Student Association \$50.00 for use of the ballroom.

Senator Soffar said the University Center Board's relations with the Student Association is of great importance this year. He went on to say that in the past the Senate had not been informed of University Center Board's actions; therefore he requested a monthly report from them and if anyone else is interested, Senator Soffar will try to obtain minutes from the University Center Board for them. The President replied that he thought that every senator should have access to the University Center Board minutes, and that he would request the minutes be placed in all Senate boxes.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Committee on Rules & Judiciary

Senator Driscoll, Chairman, met with the committee on April 4, at 6:30 to consider Cheryl Huntington for appointment to the Election Commission, and Pete Pallans and Dita Buhler for appointment to the Traffic Appeals Board. All three appointments were well qualified and their appointments were confirmed unanimously. Senator Driscoll, also, reminded senators to turn in their excuses every time they are absent. The President reminded the senators to hold their Constituency meetings and to turn in a report indicating the time and number of people attending to Senator Driscoll.

OLD BUSINESS

All the appointments reported by the Committee on Rules & Judiciary were approved. They were Cheryl Huntington, Election Commission; Pete Pallans, Traffic Appeals Board; Dita Bugler, Traffic Appeals Board. Senator Soffar moved to discharge Senate Bill No. 1, and the motion was seconded. Senator Driscoll said that he would like to wait until the author of this bill is present before discussing it. In agreement with that statement, Senator Mattern said that the bill was not pressing, and that the Senate could wait until next week when the author of the bill would be present. The motion failed. The President requested that Vice President Mattern be approved tonight as Chairman of the Committee on Fiscal & Governmental Operations. It was moved and seconded to approve Vice President Mattern. The appointment was confirmed.

NEW BUSINESS

Senator Loesch introduced Senate Bill No. 3 which was then referred to the Committee on Student Life.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

The President reminded the Executive Committee of its weekly meetings every Monday at 1:00 in the Student Association Office.

Vice President Mattern called a meeting of the Committee on Fiscal and Governmental Operations.

Senator O'Quinn announced that he held a Constituency meeting at 1:00 that day and twenty-four people attended.

Senator Driscoll and Senator Milton announced they would hold a Constituency meeting, April 6, on the second floor of the Religion Center.

Senator Jim Saxe announced his Constituency meeting for April 13, at 1:00 in the Religion Center.

Senator Trueheart announced her Constituency meeting for April 13, at 12:00 - the room to be announced later.

Senator Driscoll established regular meetings of the Committee on Rules and Judiciary to be held on Tuesdays at 6:30 in Cougar Den.

Senator Gonzales moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded and passed. The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 P. M.
