FROM THE CREDIT UNION....

Did you know....that the Internal Revenue may fine YOU \$5 for failing to supply your social security number to all sources paying you interest?

Your Credit Union is such a source... and must supply individual reports to the Internal Revenue on each person who receives \$10 or more in dividends from the Credit Union in 1963.

According to Public Law 87-397, Internal Revenue can impose a \$5 fine on the recipient of interest if that person fails to provide his social security number to each source paying interest.

The Credit Union needs your social security number...and the social security number of other members of your family. Time is running out. The Credit Union's telephone number is GR-9-2836, and they'd like for you to call your social security numbers to them!
